## What do Trainees Focus on?

- Learning more about integrated behavioral health care for children, youth, and their families
- Training in trauma informed care
- Experiencing inter-professional and collaborative models of care

## What are the Training Requirements?

**UNC-PrimeCare4Youth is designed for final year students only. All trainees are required to:**

- Train in an approved Field/internship site (e.g. Community Health Centers, Schools, Child Welfare Agencies)
- Take a 1.5 credit hour elective course
- Attend two supplemental relevant seminars
- Complete 6 hours of independent learning
- Complete standardized assessment measures
- Produce Capstone Project and participate in Capstone Showcase event

## What are the Benefits of Participation?

Trainees will receive a \$10,000 federally funded stipend, dispersed twice throughout the academic year

Train in a competitive, specialized program designed to improve the lives of children, youth, and families
